### Firearm Box a)

Indicate the type of firearm.

If you have a combination gun, you must provide the gauge and calibre. If none of the types mentioned fit, please check Other and specify. An example is a firearm design that uses a spring, compressed air or gas to propel projectiles (at a speed over 152.4 m/s, 500 ft./sec.).

## Firearm Definitions

### Non-Restricted Firearm:

- an ordinary rifle, shotgun or combination gun that is not described below as being restricted or prohibited.

### A Restricted Firearm is:

- A handgun that is not a prohibited firearm.
- A semi-automatic, centre-fire rifle or shotgun with a barrel length less than 470 mm (18.5 inches) that is not a prohibited firearm.
- A rifle or shotgun that can fire after being reduced by any temporary means (folding, telescoping) to an overall length of less than 660 mm (26 inches).
- Any firearm classified by the Governor in Council and prescribed under the *Criminal Code* as being a restricted firearm (including some long guns).

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## A Prohibited Firearm is:

- A handgun that has a barrel equal to or less than 105 mm (4.1 inches) in length, or is designed or adapted to discharge a 25 or 32 calibre cartridge, but does not include any such handgun that is prescribed, where the handgun is for use in international sporting competitions governed by the rules of the International Shooting Union [International Shooting Sport Federation];
- A rifle or shotgun that has been altered to make it less than 660 mm (26 inches) in overall length;
- A rifle or shotgun that has been altered to make the barrel length less than 457 mm (18 inches) where the overall firearm length is 660 mm (26 inches) or more;
- An automatic firearm and a converted automatic firearm;
- Any firearm prescribed to be prohibited;
- Any unlawfully manufactured firearm;
- Any firearm, other than a handgun, that discharges centre-fire ammunition in a semi-automatic manner; was originally designed with a detachable cartridge magazine with a capacity of six cartridges or more; and was designed and manufactured on or after December 15, 2023.

## Please Note

- **You cannot enter Canada with a prohibited firearm.** Prohibited firearms may be seized and forfeited to the Crown.
- **You cannot enter Canada with a restricted firearm without an ATT.** To obtain an ATT prior to entering Canada, contact the Canadian Firearms Program at 1 800 731-4000 in Canada and the USA or 506 624-6626 elsewhere.

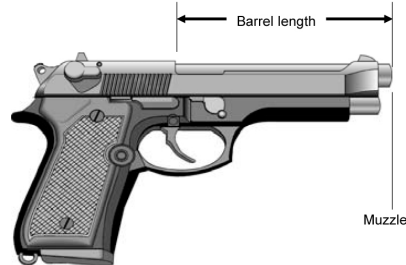
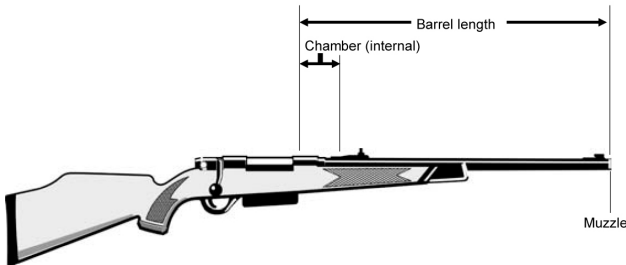
Print the serial number of your firearm.

## Firearm Box d)

Gauge/Calibre - refers to the type of ammunition the firearm uses; it is usually stamped on the barrel of the firearm.

## Firearm Box e)

For firearms other than revolvers, the barrel length is the distance from the muzzle of the barrel to and including the chamber. See the diagrams below. One way to measure the barrel length of most common long guns is to put your cleaning rod down the barrel with the action closed. Then measure the length of the cleaning rod that fits into the barrel. The barrel length of a revolver does not include the cylinder. Revolver barrel length is measured from the muzzle of the barrel to the breach end immediately in front of the cylinder.



## Firearm Box g-h)

If you are declaring a restricted firearm, please print the number of your Authorization to Transport (ATT) and its expiration date. To find out how to apply for an ATT, call the Canadian Firearms Program at 1 800 731-4000 in Canada and the USA, (506) 624-6626 outside Canada and the USA, or visit [our web site](#) before you come to Canada.

**Additional Information**

- 1. Privacy Statement** - The personal information you provide is collected under the authority of the Criminal Code of Canada, *the Firearms Act*, and associated regulations, which requires individuals who are not residents of Canada, and who do not hold a Canadian firearm licence, to declare, upon entering Canada, the temporary import of any firearms, ammunition, cartridge magazines, or firearm parts in their possession.

Once confirmed by a customs officer, this form will serve as a temporary firearm licence (and, as appropriate, a temporary registration certificate for any restricted firearms listed on this form, or on form 5590 accompanying this form) for a period of up to sixty (60) days, or the duration of any associated Authorization to Transport Restricted Firearms that has been issued by a Chief Firearms Officer. Should you wish to extend the validity of this form, or any associated Authorization to Transport, beyond the initial sixty (60) days, you must contact the relevant Chief Firearms Officer.

Completion of this form is voluntary. However, should you refuse to provide the required information, you will not be permitted to temporarily import any firearms, ammunition, cartridge magazines, or firearm parts. Provision of false or misleading information may make you liable to charges under *the Firearms Act* and/or the Criminal Code of Canada.

Personal information collected is protected under *the Privacy Act* and other laws. If you provide the information on this form to a Chief Firearms Officer, the personal information collected will be retained for the prescribed time under *the Firearms Act* and associated regulations.

Personal Information is also protected under section 107 of *the Customs Act*. However, section 107 of *the Customs Act*, as well as certain provisions under *the Privacy Act*, may allow for personal information to be disclosed for prescribed purposes as defined in the Acts.

Any personal information you supply to a Chief Firearms Officer may be used to conduct surveys aimed at improving service delivery, as well as for research, audit, evaluation, and statistical purposes. These additional uses will not result in any administrative decision being made about you.

Your personal information is administered in accordance with *the Firearms Act*, its regulations, *the Privacy Act*, *the Customs Act*, and other applicable laws. The personal information collected in this form is described in the Personal Information Banks [RCMP PPU 100 - Canadian Firearms Program](#); [RCMP PPU 037 - Canadian Firearms Information System](#); and [RCMP PPU 007 - Inquiries by Firearms Owners, Licence Applicants and the General Public](#) and is administered in accordance with *the Firearms Act*, its regulations, *the Privacy Act*, its regulations, *the Customs Act*, and other applicable laws. You have the right to the protection of your personal information including the right to request access to, and correction of your personal information where you believe there is an error or omission.

- 2.** If you are returning to Canada with the same firearms as those listed on this declaration form, you may use the form again but only if it is attached to the Non-Resident Firearm Declaration form. Every time you enter Canada, you will need to declare your firearms to the Canadian Border Services Agency.
- 3. Non-Restricted Firearms (ordinary rifles and shotguns)**  
Once this declaration has been confirmed by a customs officer, it is valid for a period of up to sixty (60) days. This confirmed declaration is also a temporary firearms licence. If you are remaining in Canada for more than sixty (60) days, you may extend the validity of your confirmation by calling the Canadian Firearms Program at 1 800 731-4000 and asking to be transferred to the Chief Firearms Officer (CFO) of the province or territory where you are.
- 4. Restricted Firearms**  
Once this declaration has been confirmed by a customs officer, it is valid for up to sixty (60) days or until the expiration date of your Authorization to Transport (ATT), whichever comes first. This confirmed declaration is also a temporary firearms licence and registration. If you are remaining in Canada for a longer period than stated on your ATT, you must call the Canadian Firearms Program at 1 800 731-4000 and ask to be transferred to the Chief Firearms Officer (CFO) of the province or territory where you are.
